1. SCOPING

1.1 What are the aims of the policy, service/service change or contract?

To provide sufficient suitable permanent sites to meet the needs of Gypsies and Travellers and Travelling Showpeople in Mid Sussex. This will be facilitated through the Local Development Framework, specifically the policy provisions of the Traveller Sites Allocations Development Plan Document.

The Traveller Sites Allocation DPD will be prepared over a number of stages. This Equalities Assessment looks at the early stages in the preparation of the DPD including public consultation.

The results of this Assessment are used to inform a Community Involvement Plan. This details how and when engagement with stakeholders is undertaken. It is proposed to update the Equalities Assessment as the DPD progresses through its work programme towards Public Examination and Adoption.

The aims are:

- To identify the permanent needs of Gypsies and Travellers and Travelling Showpeople in Mid Sussex
- -To provide the policy framework to meet this need through the allocation of new sites and/ or the intensification/ redevelopment, expansion and/ or safeguarding of existing sites;
- To ensure fair and equal treatment for Gypsies and Travellers and facilitate better integration and co-existence of the Traveller community with the settled community; and
- To reduce unauthorised Traveller encampments and unplanned and inappropriate sites being established by planning appeals.

1.2 Who does the service/policy/contract affect? Who are the main customers (internal or external)?

As future users of the sites, the actions required to meet the permanent needs of Gypsies, Travellers and Travelling Showpeople will affect these groups. There is also potential to affect anyone who lives or works near to a proposed site allocation.

The main 'customers' of the Traveller Sites Allocations DPD are:

- The Gypsy and Traveller and Travelling Showpeople community;
- Site/ landowners:
- Members of the public;
- District, Town and Parish Councillors;
- Organisations and individuals that provide services and or represent the Gypsy and Traveller community; and
- Internal customers (to MSDC) are service areas that are involved with the Gypsy and Traveller community – for instance Housing, Planning and Planning Investigations and Enforcement.

1.3 What equality information is available, including any evidence from engagement and analysis of use of services?

Evidence

- Mid Sussex District Council is committed to developing sustainable communities that are safe, healthy and inclusive and provide the amount and type of housing that meets the needs of all sectors of the community, including Gypsies and Travellers. This commitment is reflected within the Mid Sussex Sustainable Communities Strategy and the emerging Mid Sussex District Plan.
- The Housing Strategy for Mid Sussex 2009-2014 (including the Refreshed Housing Strategy 2012-2014) and Gypsy and Traveller Strategy 2009-2012 recognise that Gypsies and Travellers are amongst the most disadvantaged minority groups; seek to promote inclusive communities; and include objectives and action points supporting the provision of new sites to meet identified needs.
- The Mid Sussex Gypsy and Traveller and Travelling Showpeople Accommodation Needs Assessment published 2013 and updated 2014 identifies a need for 34 additional Gypsy and Traveller pitches for the period to 2031.
- Because of an outstanding need for additional Traveller pitches in Mid Sussex, the Council
 has historically found itself in the position of granting several (temporary) planning
 permissions for Traveller sites, some following planning appeal.
- There is historic and on-going evidence of unauthorised encampments within the district.
- The emerging Mid Sussex District Plan will include a policy that will set a target for the provision of Gypsy and Traveller sites and for determining planning applications for Gypsy and Traveller sites should they come forward.
- Evidence has been gathered from past public consultation exercises on the District Plan and the Statement of Community Involvement. This demonstrates that Gypsies and Travellers have not previously engaged with the planning process.

1.4 What does this information tell us about the equality issues associated with the service and implications for the protected groups?

Traditionally, unless directly engaged, Gypsy and Traveller groups are seldom heard during consultation on planning documents. Given the importance of the allocations document for the Traveller community, particular effort must be made to engage with this group in an appropriate manner in forming the document.

The provision of an adequate supply of suitable and sustainably located permanent sites would help to facilitate fair and equal treatment for Gypsies and Travellers with subsequent benefits including promoting better access to health and education and better integration and coexistence of the Traveller community with the settled community and would assist in reducing unauthorised Traveller encampments.
