Introduction

Welcome to the spring edition of the Planning and Economy Business Newsletter.

As we enter a new financial year, we would like to reflect on all the important activities the Planning and Economy Team have been working on over the last year.

The Team successfully launched the Economic Development Strategy last June. Following its launch, more promotional activities have been taking place throughout the District to promote the strategy and its priority themes. Events include our annual 'Open4Business' event held in March and hosted at the former Haywards Heath College site. The event attracted over 120 delegates on the day, including a variety of local, national and international businesses. More details on this event can be found on page two.

Other activities that have taken place over the last year include the launch of the second year of the Micro Business Grant Scheme. Approximately £72,000 was awarded to 40

businesses over the last year. The funding supported a wide range of business growth activities for small businesses in Mid Sussex. We are delighted to announce the return of the Micro Business Grant scheme for this year. More details can be found on page two.

In line with the Corporate Plans objective to deliver sustainable economic growth, the last year has seen developments in our three main towns Burgess Hill, Haywards Heath and East Grinstead, as follows:

- In Burgess Hill, the new Lidl site in has been under development over the last few months. The store is situated on the former gas holder site on Leyland's Road and will provide a new modern retail space for local residents.
- On 'The Hub' employment site, Phase one of the employment site has been completed and has delivered a new 4,000m² warehousing facility for DPD. Planning permission has been approved for phase two of the development and will deliver over 5,000m² of employment space for Roche Diagnostics.

- In Haywards Heath, work is underway on Perrymount Road to develop new residential and commercial space. The development will include 145 new residential units (30 per cent of which are affordable) with commercial floor space and new car parking facilities.

In autumn 2018, the site of the former Perrymount House was demolished to make way for the development of a new 78 bed Premier Inn hotel. The hotel presents a great opportunity to invite business visitors into Mid Sussex by offering well located accommodation with a variety of shops, restaurants and travel in one location.

- Development is also well underway on the £24 million investment to redevelop the former Martells building on Queens Walk, East Grinstead. Works on this development are now at an advanced stage, with the application for phase two of the redevelopment approved in December. Phase two will provide shops, residential apartments, cycle storage and amenity space.

Open4Business: Skills and Apprenticeships Success



On 14 March 2019, the Council hosted its annual Open4Business event. This year's theme was 'skills and apprenticeships' and was held at the former Haywards Heath 6th form college site on Harlands Road.

The event offered an exhibition, speaker programme and featured a popup student café, managed by students and staff at Crawley College. The speaker programme included a variety of talks from expert speakers, many of whom were local businesses or enterprises. Topics included busting myths about apprenticeships, the importance of STEM skills, meeting the skills challenge, and much more.

Open4Business also gave the Chichester College Group an opportunity to discuss their plans to re-open the college to offer post-16 provision in Mid Sussex. This provision will offer a variety of further educational pathways including; A-Levels, T-Levels, Apprenticeships and the opportunity to progress into Higher Education. The proposed opening is September 2020, with much work underway to meet this target.

Micro Business Grants

Micro Business grants are returning for the third consecutive year. Building on the success of previous years, funding has been secured for business grants that aim to support small local businesses in their growth and development.

This year the Council has again been awarded £72,000 from the West Sussex Local Enterprise and Apprenticeship Platform.

Grants of up to £2,000 are available on a 50 per cent match-funding basis to small businesses throughout the District. In addition to grants for new projects, a further £1,500 is available to support the costs of hiring an apprentice.

Bids will be assessed against four key criteria and to be eligible for the scheme, bids must demonstrate that the project will result in one or more of the following:

- Creating new sustainable employment, this can include recruiting an apprentice
- The development of new business lines
- Creating a wider customer base
- Delivering wider community benefits.

The step-by-step application process is as follows:

Step 1	Businesses submit applications. Officers may request further information if needed
Step 2	An officer will undertake a due diligence review of your business to ensure it meets the eligibility criteria
Step 3	Officers will make a recommendation to the Council's Cabinet Grants Panel who will make a decision on your application

Independent Retailers' Training Scheme

In 2018 the Council launched the Independent Retailers' Training Scheme. The scheme offered independent retailers throughout the district an opportunity to attend workshops dedicated to developing skills as a high street retailer and improving business. The scheme was very successful and offered training opportunities for independent retailers in Mid Sussex.

Workshops covered a range of subjects, including visual merchandising, retail marketing, sales, customer service, inventory and stock management.

Retailers who completed at least one workshop were then eligible to receive one to one sessions from training partner, Martec International. The scheme delivered 6 workshops from November 2018 and welcomed 49 attendees into training.

In addition to the workshops, twenty one-to-one sessions were conducted with retailers interested in understanding where they can develop from a personal business perspective.

Feedback from retailers included:

"We were taking an average of £600 to £700 a day... Then, after the Martec workshop this week we had sales of £2,000 the next day! We'd almost tripled our previous daily takings."
