Arrange for the collection of bulky and electrical waste, such as old furniture or appliances from your home. This is a chargeable service per item.



We provide a free clinical waste collection service. It includes the provision of clinical waste sacks and/or yellow lidded sharps boxes for sharps such as epi-pens and diabetic syringes.



We offer assisted collection services for residents who are physically unable to take out their rubbish, recycling and garden waste to the boundary of their property.
