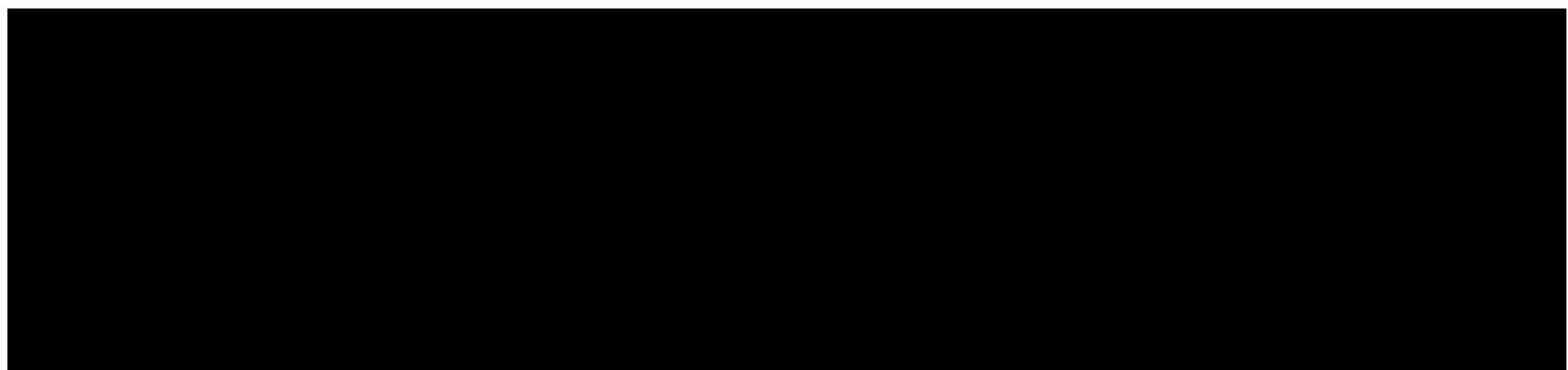
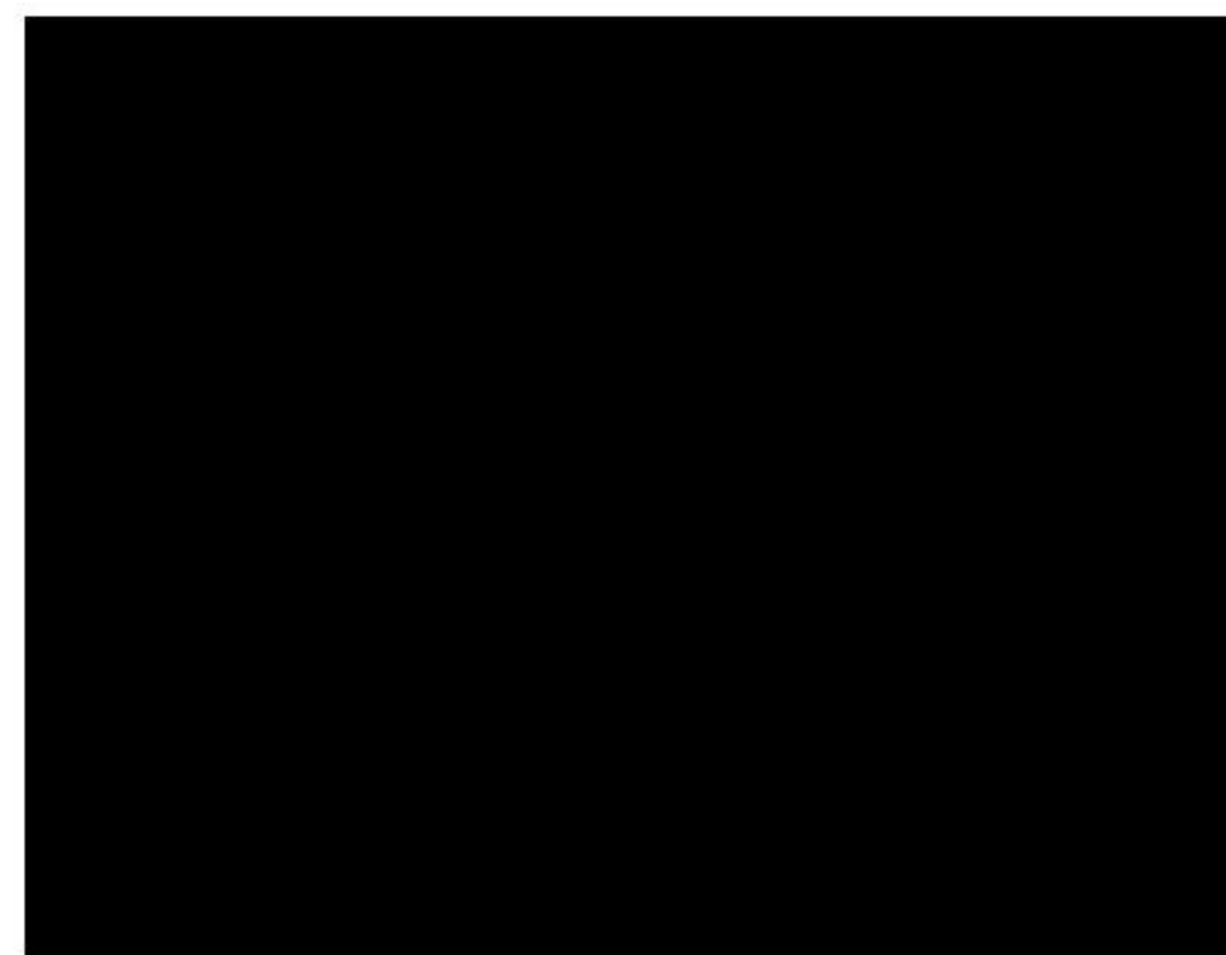

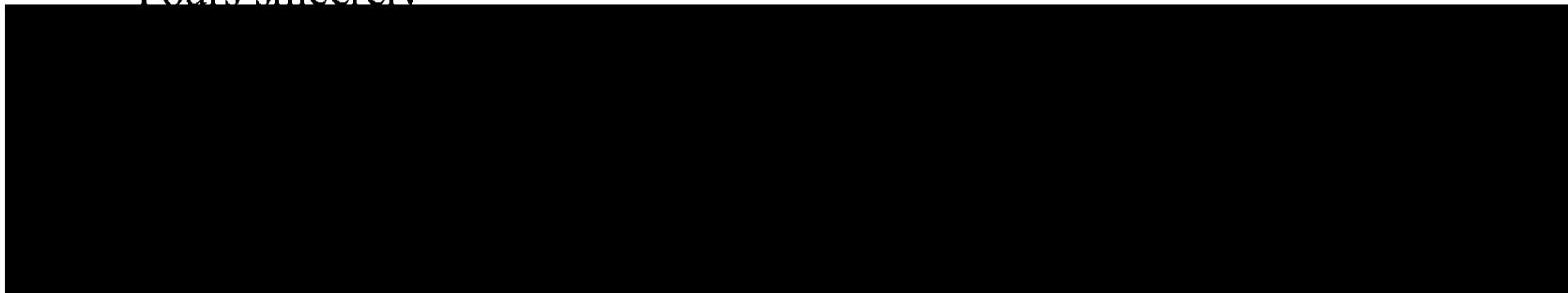

PROPOSED UPGRADE OF FOOTPATH TO BRIDLEWAY NORTH OF ANSTY, WEST SUSSEX**

We write on behalf of the British Horse Society and Mid Sussex Area Bridleways Group.

We understand that, as part of the scheme covered by this planning application, an existing public footpath is to be upgraded to a public bridleway. Whilst we generally welcome any additional bridleway as providing additional equestrian access, it is essential that new bridleways should either connect to another bridleway or have a safe access and egress point for equestrians. The scheme as presently proposed does not appear to meet this criteria.
