Recovery and Growth

As we move into Autumn with the lifting of many Covid restrictions, our sights are firmly set on recovery and business growth. This quarterly newsletter includes details of our recently launched Independent Retailers Support Programme including store improvement grants and a roundup of other FREE business support available, from funding and training workshops to innovation support.

This issue also features one of the most significant projects underway in Mid Sussex, our digital infrastructure project and below you can find out what has been achieved, what's next, and how businesses can benefit.

Grants and Free Online Support for Independent Retailers

The Independent Retailers Support Programme offers FREE online training as well as store improvement grants.

The training is available via a dedicated online platform, the <u>West Sussex</u>

Retail Hub. Retail businesses can register for free access to a series of support modules designed to help strengthen skills, build confidence and improve knowledge of key topics. Delivered by a range of industry experts, topics range from social media and business planning to creating an exciting instore experience.

The online platform provides the opportunity for businesses to pick and choose the topics of most value to them, at a time that suits them. The hub launched in July with special guest Mark Smith, Chief Operating Officer at Sweaty Betty joining us online to share his views on the future of the high street and role of the physical store. He is an enthusiastic advocate and it was great listening to him. A recording of the session is available to watch on the hub.

The West Sussex Retail Hub is just one part of a broader programme of support including grant funding. £40,000 has been allocated for store improvement grants, with grants of £500 to £4,000 available. Applications

will open later this month, with businesses urged to apply as soon as possible. Further details, terms and online application will be available via our website here

Businesses Urged to Apply for Discounted Business Rates

Reminder - Calling all businesses or organisations in Mid Sussex that are eligible or could potentially qualify for the Business Rates Expanded Retail Discount for the Leisure, Hospitality and Retail sector or the Nursery Discount.

A maximum discount of 66% is available subject to a cash cap. All businesses wanting to receive these discounts will need to complete a simple online claim form at https://midsussex.grantapproval.co.uk/

A number of businesses have applied to help them pay their business rates from the 1st July 2021, but many qualifying businesses have yet to apply.

Digital Infrastructure in Mid Sussex: What Next?



Following the successful completion of the Burgess Hill Local Full Fibre Network, we are now moving forward into the operations and commercialisation stage. The programme so far has seen over £6m invested and over 90km of fibre laid across Mid Sussex

The next stage involves the Council supporting commercial telecom suppliers, to help connect businesses and residents to the network. We have already received many enquiries from local businesses and are excited to be moving forward. Mid Sussex is a member of the Cooperative Network Infrastructure (CNI) organisation (www.cni.coop) which gives immediate access to the market and a wide range of telecom operators and providers.

What are the benefits of a full fibre network?

In our area, most broadband services are run over a mixture of traditional copper telephone lines (ADSL), a little bit of fibre, or coaxial cables. This limits the speeds and capabilities of services which often makes for a frustrating online experience. Our new 'full fibre' solution is capable of much quicker speeds as it is not hindered by the old telephone network. Initially typically up to 1GB with faster speeds as the network develops.


What can businesses expect next?

Connecting to our new network means that businesses and residents can enjoy much better performance when relying on connectivity with hyper fast speeds to power your bandwidth hungry applications. Working closely with CNI members, we are agreeing a structured "roll-out" plan over the next 6 to 12 months and beyond, to connect businesses and residents to full fibre. We will continue to provide regular updates of when connection milestones are planned and have been achieved

Who do I contact to connect to this full fibre network?

The Council and CNI are building an on-line "landing-page" which will contain all the information that businesses and residents will need to see if they can be connected to the network. This will also contain details about services available from CNI and its members. The landing page will be live towards the end of October, enquiries in the short-term can be made directly to <u>CNI</u>, or

LoCASE Grants of up to £10,000

The Low Carbon Across the South and East (LoCASE) scheme provides businesses with grants of up to £10,000 to grow their business or make energy efficiency improvements.

These grants are **now available to businesses in West Sussex**. There are two types of grant:

- <u>LoCASE Business Development Grants</u> available to SMEs offering low carbon (or "green") goods or services.
- <u>LoCASE Energy Efficiency Grants</u> are available to any SME. These grants cover renewable energy and energy efficiency projects.
