Mid Sussex has come together to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee and it was fantastic to see so many community events paying tribute to Her Majesty's long record of public service for our country. Over 50 road closures took place during the Bank Holiday weekend for street parties, the Council



provided small grants to 37 community celebrations and 250 trees have been planted for the Queen's Green Canopy project.

We also want to recognise those in Mid Sussex who do incredible things locally. Mid Sussex Applauds is back to recognise community stars and you can nominate now.

Across the summer, there is a huge amount going on at Mid Sussex's three leisure centres, as featured in this edition. During the pandemic, the Council has used its reserves to support our leisure centres through periods of reduced capacity and it's great to see residents have returned.

The Council has now agreed our Sustainable Economy Strategy – a clear plan for how we will support the local economy and work to achieve carbon net zero. Mid Sussex is a highly attractive area for new businesses, and we want to ensure that residents are seeing the benefits in new jobs and opportunities, as well as playing our part in tackling climate change.

We are also moving forward with our plans for a Centre for Outdoor Sports, the biggest investment in local sports provision in Mid Sussex in a generation. Funded as an infrastructure gain from new development, it will see new outdoor sports pitches built on a new 9-hectare site and we are working to have it open in 2025.

Burgess Hill

We are looking to create an Urban Park at the Martlets Shopping Centre in Burgess Hill to make the area more attractive. Space was cleared in 2019 to enable NewRiver REIT to progress its plans for new shops, restaurants, and leisure attractions.

NewRiver remains committed to delivering town centre regeneration in Burgess Hill, but a challenging national retail environment means there is not clear timeline for the start of work.

A temporary Urban Park will brighten up the area and create a space where people can meet and relax. Our aim is to use materials that can be reused and quickly relocated to other sites when the town centre redevelopment is ready to proceed. More details will follow soon. www.burgesshill.net

Supporting the Blue Campaign

Our Blue Campaign meadow at Beech Hurst Gardens was looking fabulous in this picture. As part of the Blue Campaign, we allow areas of public open space to grow during the spring and summer months. It creates natural meadow areas that encourage native insects, wildlife and grassland species to thrive.

Across the District we have set aside 40 areas for the Blue Campaign this year (up from 25 last year). The sites can be easily identified by blue heart signs and symbols.

Update on the revised District Plan

In line with government requirements, the Council is preparing a revised District Plan to plan for future growth and protect the district from speculative development.

Following the discussion at the Scrutiny Committee in January this year, Officers have been undertaking the work asked for by the Committee on both the brownfield and windfall allowances and have continued to work with our neighbours over unmet housing need and water neutrality matters.

Cllr Ash–Edwards, the Leader of the Council, on behalf of the Council, has written to the Secretary of State, Michael Gove MP, to challenge the number of houses the Government was asking Mid Sussex to accommodate. His letter called for an urgent review of the Government's Planning White Paper.

In May 2022, the Government announced proposed changes to the planning system. Its Levelling Up and Regeneration Bill includes reforms that ensure new development uses good design, produces more local infrastructure, is shaped by local people's democratic wishes, and improves environmental outcomes. The Bill proposes to give much greater legal weight to Local Plans when planning decisions are made. However, no changes to overall housing numbers and there are proposals that the Government may take plan making powers away from councils that do not keep their Local Plans up to date. This means it is more important than ever to have an up-to-date District Plan in Mid Sussex.

The Council has also held briefings with all Town and Parish Councils on how a revised District Plan will help properly manage development in Mid Sussex, help secure much needed infrastructure and will help secure the delivery of sustainable places and update on the work officers have undertaken.

New Mid Sussex Centre

for Outdoor Sport

Work is underway to provide a new 9-hectare Centre for Outdoor Sport to the west of Burgess Hill.

Earlier this year Council Cabinet Members were presented with an initial Feasibility study outlining the range of sporting facilities that could be built to the south of the A2300 in Burgess Hill. The Study shows that there is enough space for multiple sports pitches, community pavilions, changing facilities and dedicated parking on the site.

Consultants will now work with local sports groups and the wider community to develop detailed designs and ensure the views of all potential users are considered. Feedback from the local community will help to shape the plans over the next 12–months, with the aim of obtaining planning permission in 2023 and opening first class sports facilities to the public in 2025.



Safe Space Sussex app

Launched by the Sussex Police and Crime Commissioner, Katy Bourne, and supported by the Mid Sussex Partnership, this Sussex-wide app has been created to form a network of locations, offering a safe space for people to go to if they feel threatened or at risk of harm.

This free app will direct those at risk to available safe spaces nearby where someone can wait until the Police or a trusted contact can reach them, or until they have been able to access any necessary information and advice to keep them safe.

The app also has other features, such as the ability to auto-text a named person and an automatic recording function which will be saved to the phone. It can be downloaded for free from the Apple app store or Google play store.


Jubilee Celebrations 2022




Design a Jubilee woodland

Outdoors Matters



Mid Sussex District Council maintains over 80 grass sports pitches spread across the district. These sports pitches cater for football, rugby, cricket, stoolball, lawn bowls and we even have a grass athletics track.

During the 2021/22 season we had over 1100 football and rugby fixtures from 43 clubs on the pitches, as well as being used many more times for training sessions. We will also be having over 450 fixtures from 23 clubs on summer sports pitches over the course of their season too.



MAY TO SEPTEMBER Summer sports season

Different sports can be played on the same site through the year allowing as many people as possible to benefit from them. Constant and varied use can however put a strain on the pitches so we work closely with our grounds maintenance contractors and clubs to carry out regular maintenance and essential renovation works so that the playing surfaces can be maintained and renovated to the highest possible quality for each sport.

Pitch sanding is one important part of our sports pitch maintenance programme, it assists with the drainage of the subsoil which allows the grass to grow stronger and be more resilient. Most of the pitches in Mid Sussex have slow drainage due to being on clay soil therefore there is a risk of standing water after periods of heavy rain. In the worst cases this can make a pitch unplayable which in turn can create problems for the leagues and clubs to find alternative dates to play missed games. Mid Sussex District Council work closely with the clubs and leagues



to make sure that there are always available pitches elsewhere wherever possible in the district if needed.

A senior sized football pitch will need around 60 tons of sand on average. We sanded 30 pitches in 2021 and will do 36 more in 2022 totalling 3200 tons of sand spread over our winter sports pitches. Our grounds maintenance contractors also carry out regular grass cutting, and other operations across the course of the year to our sports pitches to provide ideal playing conditions for all sports and activities. We carry out as many of these activities in the spring when the ground begins to dry slightly, and we can use the heaviest, more productive machinery without causing further damage.

Food waste trial starting this autumn

We are working with West Sussex County Council on a food waste collection trial to enhance recycling and rubbish collection services across three areas of the District. The areas chosen will have a mix of housing types and will be spread across the district in order to be as representative as possible.

Approximately 3,000 households will be taking part in the trial from September 2022, which will provide a weekly kerbside collection of food waste. There will also be a weekly opt-in collection service of absorbent hygiene products (AHP) and a reduction in the frequency of rubbish bin collections to once every three weeks.

Am I part of the trial?

Residents who live in the trial areas will be contacted with full details of how the service will work and offered support and access to all the information they will need. If you are part of the trial and still have any queries, please email wastematters@midsussex.gov.uk

The trial will enable us to evaluate the proposed new service changes in a controlled manner, gaining valuable feedback from residents and giving us the opportunity to carry out a thorough review which will be vital to helping plan improvements to our future recycling and waste collection services.

According to information on the Government website (**www.apprenticeships.gov.uk**):

- 86% of employers said apprenticeships helped them develop skills relevant to their organisation
- 78% of employers said apprenticeships helped to improve productivity
- 74% of employers said apprenticeships helped to improve the quality of their product or service.

Many programmes are flexible, which means you can adapt your training to fit the needs of your business.

Apprenticeships can also be a very valuable way to upskill or retrain your existing workforce.

They provide development opportunities for experienced employees to gain a formal qualification in their specialist area – or enable a member of staff to progress into a different area of your business. Your staff are your biggest asset, apprenticeships equip them with the tools they need to excel in their roles.

How much do apprenticeships cost?

Apprenticeships are funded by contributions made by the Government and employers. How much an employer contributes can vary, depending on a number of things including the type of role and the size of the company.

As an employer, you can also get funding from the Government. The apprenticeship experts at Chichester College Group will be able to discuss these options with you.

Mid Sussex District Council has approved a new Sustainable Economy Strategy and Action Plan 2022–2025 setting out how we can achieve economic prosperity and social wellbeing, without compromising the environment.

Faced with the challenges of climate change and the UK Government's commitment to becoming carbon net-zero by 2050, we recognised the need for a new approach – one that drives economic growth, attracts investment, and recognises the uniqueness of our environment whilst improving the prospects of our residents. The Sustainable Economy Strategy seeks to strike this balance.

The Strategy provides a clear framework for action focused under three themes of People, Place and Partnership.

The Strategy includes commitments to support and improve the area's high levels of employment and skills by

- continuing to deliver high value employment opportunities across the district including the proposed Science and Technology Park at Burgess Hill
- promoting access to training to give people the opportunity to develop the skills they need
- supporting entrepreneurs to start and grow businesses.

Mid Sussex District Council will

- work to reduce its own carbon-emissions
- work with businesses to develop and promote support available to help them on their own low carbon journey
- facilitate the delivery of new sustainable infrastructure, including working with West Sussex County Council to significantly increase electric vehicle charging points
- promote sustainable travel options including green travel plans and active travel
- further improve the district's digital infrastructure
- increase biodiversity through land management and rewilding
- develop plans for a Social Value and Sustainability Charter to ensure that there is commitment to support the aims of the Strategy from suppliers and contractors
- encourage procurement from local organisations.

By working with partner organisations to deliver economic growth, combat climate change, maximise biodiversity, and promote and enable improvements to the health and wellbeing of residents, the Council has set out a strong roadmap for the future.

Helping Businesses towards a Low Carbon Future

Reducing carbon emissions is a vital step for businesses large and small, as together we address climate change and seek to build long– term resilience and profitability in the face of climate risk.

While many of the districts' larger businesses are advanced on their sustainability journey, it can be a daunting process for smaller businesses. Only 20% of small businesses have currently committed to a Net Zero target, in contrast to 50% of larger businesses. In addition, 7/10 business chiefs said plans to achieve carbon neutrality have been pushed back by the pandemic.

We have been working with neighbouring authorities across West Sussex to share best practice and support businesses to take that all important first step. A new video series showcases businesses who are working to lower their carbon footprint and highlights the business case for change.

Clair Hall



Meet BOP, the consultants carrying out the next stages of assessment and planning

for Clair Hall.

Can you describe the process you will be following with Clair Hall?

We are following a robust evidencebased approach which is split over two phases. In phase A, we will undertake a cultural analysis of the infrastructure in Haywards Heath and its surrounding areas. In phase B, we will start exploring what could be delivered on the site and how. Delivering multifunctional community facilities is always a complex task, more so now, after the pandemic changed the landscape of the wider sector.

What you are aiming to achieve?

Initially we want to understand local gaps and opportunities of the cultural landscape in Haywards Heath. Both stages of our work should help us narrow down options and inform how the Council should go about its ambitions to provide community facilities on the site. In the first stage we are working with the Council to agree the success criteria for the site and future provision. Next, we will explore opportunities that can fill the key gaps and meet the agreed criteria. Our work will provide recommendations for the best route to achieve that on the Clair Hall site.

What are the timescales for completing this work?

We started our work in April and will report back to the MSDC's Cabinet in July. This will summarise the first stage of our work and agree next steps. The next report is planned after the summer.

Can you give some examples of your experience in this type of work?

We have worked extensively with local authorities on similar projects across the UK. These projects have included options appraisals, viability and feasibility studies for a breadth of cultural community assets. We are also experts in place-based cultural strategy so understand how individual assets contribute to and support a places' wider cultural ecosystem. We have an extensive client base beyond local authorities that include sector bodies, arts organisations, operators and developers which makes us well placed to understand the potential opportunities a site like Clair Hall presents.

How do previous projects you have been involved in inform your thinking of the importance of cultural and

creative industries and spaces to UK towns and villages?

Our approach is strategic and aligned with the key social, economic, and environmental goals of our clients and stakeholders. We recognise the nuances of the creative and cultural industries across regions and adapt our approach accordingly. Through our work over the last 25 years we've developed a network within and around the sector who we call on where relevant to help us understand the local context.

What are your initial thoughts on the kind of new facilities we could have for Mid Sussex on the Clair Hall site?

This is a fantastic asset for the Haywards Heath community. We are in the initial stages of our work, and we acknowledge the challenges of the current financial climate. However, we hope the site can deliver a high–quality community facility with arts and culture at its core, offering multiple uses for the current and future community.

Residents


