

# Christmas and New Year Rubbish and Recycling Collections 2022 – 2023

Rubbish and recycling collection days will change for one week over the Christmas and New Year period. Your festive collections are as follows:

Monday 2 January 2023 onwards	No Change

Please make sure your bins are at the edge of your property, at the point nearest the highway, by 7am on the day of collection.

All rubbish and recycling collections will return to normal from Monday 2 January 2023

#### **Garden Waste**

There will be no garden waste collections between **Monday 26 December** and **Friday 6 January.** Garden waste collections will return to normal from **Monday 9 January 2023** 

#### **Christmas Trees**

Real Christmas trees can be composted in your garden waste bin. Just make sure the lid is closed. There will also be temporary sites across Mid Sussex where you can drop off your real Christmas tree, open from **Friday 30 December 2022** until **Friday 13 January 2023** (inclusive). #### Yes Please (put these items in your blue lidded recycling bin)

Moulded plastic packaging (e.g. toys, chocolates, biscuits); **Plastic** 

all food pots, tubs and trays

Foil trays, foil cases, blister packs, takeaway containers, tin foil Foil

Metal Biscuit and sweet tins, cans, bottle and jar lids, empty aerosols

including squirty cream

Champagne/wine bottles, perfume/aftershave bottles, beer bottles and jars Glass

Paper and Card Folded boxes, cardboard crisp tubes, juice/fruit cartons, paper hats,

Christmas cards (no bows or adornments), wrapping paper (non shiny and scrunchable), gift tags, Christmas crackers (remove contents and snap)

#### No Thank you (put these items in your black lidded rubbish bin)

Bubble wrap, polystyrene packaging, plastic bags, film lids, cling film, **Plastic** 

sweet wrappers, food pouches

Foil Crisp packets, scrunched up / dirty foil Glass Broken drinking glasses and crockery

**Paper and Card** Shredded paper, paper/kitchen towels, serviettes, wet paper / card
