Privacy Notice - Applicants for licences.

Mid Sussex District Council will use your personal information for the purposes of assessing and determining your application. This will include information relating to convictions, health, nationality and ethnic origin (where applicable). The information will be used on an on-going basis for administration of the licensing regime. Your personal information will be safeguarded and processed in accordance with data protection requirements.

We may share and receive information from the police, DVLA, Home Office, DWP, Cabinet Office, Motor Insurers Bureau (MIB), DVSA, RPSCA, other local authorities and organisations (for taxis this may include private hire operators). We may also share information with other council departments. This information will be shared for the purposes of assessing your application and your continuing fitness to hold a licence. We may also share your information for the purposes of the prevention and detection of crime. We may use such information to revoke, suspend or refuse your licence. The council may publish details of convictions or enforcement actions against licence holders. If the council suspend or revoke a licence, this information may be entered onto a national refusals register and details of the revocation shared with other local authorities upon request.

After an application is granted, some information will be made available for public inspection via public registers in accordance with our statutory obligations. Please refer to our website for further information.

#### **Guidance Notes**

- 1. Describe the premises and the nature of the business for example the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the application.
- 2. The plan does not need to be scaled or professionally drawn. It should indicate the area to be licensed and identify relevant details (kennels, stables, for home boarding relevant rooms).
- 3. Do not delay submitting the application form if you are still awaiting the DBS Certificate. It will be accepted separately. Please note a licence cannot be granted without a relevant DBS certificate.
- 4. In terms of specific licensable activities please note:
  - Boarding Dogs and Cats: Please provide numbers of animals that you seek a licence for. Kennel establishments – please provide numbers of kennels to be used.
  - Breeding Dogs Please provide a list of breeding bitches
  - Selling animals as pets: Please provide a list of species that you intend to sell.
  - Hiring out Horses; please provide a list of animals including names and ages that you intend to use
  - Keeping or training animals for exhibition: Please provide a list of species and their ages.
- 5. Fees for all licences are split into two sections
  - a. A fee payable at time of making the application
  - b. A fee payable on the grant of the licence.

Applicants can pay both sections on application. If the application is not granted the second part of the fee will be reimbursed.

- 6. <u>Hiring of Horses and Breeding Dogs</u>
  - a. A separate vet's fee is applicable for all inspections relating to Hiring of Horses, this will be invoiced separately and must be paid before the licence is granted.
  - b. A vet's fee is due for all new applications to breed dogs. This will be invoiced separately and must be paid before the licence is granted.
- 7. Persons who may not apply for a licence Schedule 8
  - a. A person who has at any time held a licence which was revoked under regulation 15 of these Regulations.
  - A person who has at any time held a licence which was revoked under regulation 17 of the Animal Welfare (Breeding of Dogs) (Wales) Regulations 2014.
  - c. A person who has at any time held a licence which was revoked under regulation 13 of the Welfare of Wild Animals in Travelling Circuses (England) Regulations 2012.
  - d. A person who is disqualified under section 33 of the Welfare of Animals Act (Northern Ireland) 2011.
  - e. A person who has at any time held a licence which was revoked under regulation 12 of the Welfare of Racing Greyhounds Regulations 2010.

- f. A person who is disqualified under section 34 of the Animal Welfare Act 2006.
- g. A person who is disqualified under section 40(1) and (2) of the Animal Health and Welfare (Scotland) Act 2006.
- h. A person who is disqualified under section 4(1) of the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991.
- i. A person who is disqualified under Article 33A of the Dogs (Northern Ireland) Order 1983.
- j. A person who is disqualified under section 6(2) of the Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1976 from keeping a dangerous wild animal.
- k. A person who is disqualified under section 3(3) of the Breeding of Dogs Act 1973 from keeping a breeding establishment for dogs.
- I. A person who is disqualified under section 4(3) of the Riding Establishments Act 1964 from keeping a riding establishment.
- m. A person who is disqualified under section 3(3) of the Animal Boarding Establishments Act 1963 from keeping a boarding establishment for animals.
- n. A person who is disqualified under section 5(3) of the Pet Animals Act 1951 from keeping a pet shop.
- o. A person who is disqualified under section 1(1) of the Protection of Animals (Amendment) Act 1954 from having custody of an animal.
- p. A person who is disqualified under section 4(2) of the Performing Animals (Regulation) Act 1925.
- q. A person who is disqualified under section 3 of the Protection of Animals Act 1911 from the ownership of an animal.
