West Sussex County Council Trading Standards Service (the 'Responsible Authority') contends the following licensing objectives have been undermined by the carrying on of licensable activities at these premises:							
- the prevention of crime and disorder and - the protection of children from harm							
Full particulars in support of the application are to be found in the next section, but in summary:							
Prevention of crime and disorder On the 27 th June 2023, during a controlled Trading Standards Test purchasing exercise, a shop employee at Yowu Limited t/a London Road Food and Wine, 65 London Road, East Grinstead, West Sussex, RH19 1EQ, sold alcohol to a Trading Standards volunteer who was under the age of 18.							

The sale of alcohol to a person under the age of 18 is a criminal offence under the Licensing Act 2003.

Protection of children from harm

Despite the store displaying Challenge 25 signage around the premises and claiming to operate such policy, the seller did not follow the guidance of such policy, contrary to the Licence Mandatory condition and Part 2 -Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

"The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol"

"The premises will operate an age verification policy set at a minimum of 25 years, whereby any person attempting to buy alcohol who appears to be under 25 (or the age set by the policy) will be asked for photographic ID to prove their age."

2023

The Responsible Authority received several complaints, alleging Yowu Limited t/a London Road Food and Wine, 65 London Road, East Grinstead, West Sussex, RH19 1EQ of selling e-cigarettes to individuals aged under 18.

On the 2nd of June 2023, a Trading Standards Officer from the Responsible Authority conducted an advice visit in relation to selling age restricted products. The Trading Standards Officer spoke to one of the directors of the business, Mr Ibrahim KAHRAMAN on the phone about the underage sales advice visit. The advice visit continued with one of the shop employees. Several points around age restricted products and training were discussed during the advice visit.

On the 5th of June 2023, a follow up advice letter, which reiterated what was discussed from the advice visit, was sent to Mr KAHRAMAN'S email address.

On the 27th of June 2023 as part of an underage sales operation the Responsible Authority were carrying out that day. A 16-year-old volunteer under the instruction and supervision of the Responsible Authority entered Yowu Limited t/a London Road Food and Wine, 65 London Road, East Grinstead, West Sussex, RH19 1EQ. The child volunteer selected one WKD Blue bottle of alcohol and took it to the till. A female working behind the till area sold the WKD Blue bottle of alcohol to the child volunteer, without asking them for any identification.

After securing the Blue WKD bottle of alcohol as evidence, Trading Standards Officers immediately returned the shop to explain to the seller about the test purchase and take all the necessary and relevant information to instigate an investigation. The director Mr KAHRAMAN was present when Trading Standards Officers entered the shop and listened while Trading Standards officers were talking to the seller, Ms Bushra Mohammed JANKEER.

The alcohol bottle of Blue WKD was shown to the seller. Under caution, Ms JANKEER explained what an age restricted product was. The seller explained that

she did not know the drink she sold to the volunteer was alcohol. The seller stated that she did not remember the volunteer and was unable to say what age they thought the volunteer was. When the seller was asked about 'Think 25' Policy she said she was aware. When asked about till prompts, the seller went to the till and scanned the WKD Blue evidence bag, which showed there were no till prompts. The seller was asked about any refusal logs, which the seller could not locate. Another employee found the refusal near the counter. When the seller was asked about any training, she confirmed she has had training and signed something, however there were no records of this when checked.

Trading Standards Officers questioned Mr KAHRAMAN, as to why there was no records for the sellers training. Mr KAHRAMAN explained that the seller usually stacks shelves and that is the reason why there is no training record for her.

Under Section 146 of the Licensing Act 2003, it is a criminal offence to sell alcohol to a child under the age of 18 years old. Section 146 (4) contains a defence 'that he believed the individual was 18 or over, and he had either taken all reasonable steps to find out the individual's age or that no one could reasonably suspect from their appearance that they were under 18.'

It is contended the sale of alcohol to an underage person in the circumstances outlined is a breach of the licensing objective 'the protection of children from harm'. The licensee has failed in their responsibilities to promote this licensing objective. In considering a review of this premises licence, the committee are reminded that the second licensing objective 'Prevention of Crime and Disorder' has also been failed by commission of the criminal offence that took place on the 27th June 2023.

In view of the above, the Responsible Authority do not believe the licensing objectives are being continually upheld at Yowu Limited t/a London Road Food and Wine, 65 London Road, East Grinstead, West Sussex, RH19 1EQ, and deem it both proportionate and necessary to invite the committee to consider a review of the premises licence, to limit further criminal activity by this licence holder and to act as a deterrent to other operators considering such illegal conduct.

As underage age advice had been provided before the sale of alcohol was made to a Trading Standards volunteer. The Responsible Authority suggests an appropriate outcome of the review would be a three-month suspension and further conditions added to the licence.
